PHI-101/EI - GREEK PHILOSOPHY

UNIT- 1- The Ionics

- 1) The Ionian philosophers discovered what it means to think, and then they taught the student all what thinking is good for.
- 2) The Pythagorean number theories helps the student to understand the beauty of unity, it is harmony that allows the parts to function together as an integrated whole.
- 3) Studying Parmenides make the student realise the multiplicity of existing things, their changing forms and motion, are but an appearance of a single eternal reality ("Being"), thus giving rise to the Parmenidean principle that "all is one".
